8 Light it right

10 ways to decorate on a dime

Transform your home without spending a bundle. These tips, tricks and easy projects lend a professional look for less

1 Move in
Update your living room or family room by rearranging the furniture so that not everything is against a wall. It will improve the traffic flow. Plus, placing chairs closer to the sofa facilitates conversation.

2 Hit the walls
Installing a chair rail or molding is an inexpensive update that lends elegance to a room. As an alternative, consider painting a narrow stripe along the top of walls, 2 to 4 inches from the ceiling—a simple detail that adds visual impact.

3 Reflect on this
Hanging a mirror in your living room adds a touch of glamour, and it makes the room feel larger and brighter. Just be sure not to place the mirror between windows—which can distract from the view.

4 Judge books by their cover
Pick up colorful hardcovers at a thrift store or cover plain books with decorative paper; then use them to give bookshelves a chic tweak. When arranging shelves, try laying a few books flat and using them as a pedestal for a special knickknack. Leave some empty space so shelves don't seem overloaded. Give a plain bookcase a quick makeover by painting the rear panel a bold hue or covering it with patterned wallpaper.

5 Go long
Position curtain rods above the window frame and select drapes that extend all the way to the floor. Your ceilings will appear higher, making the room feel airy; and the long curtains add drama. Use rods that are wider than the frame to make windows look larger.

6 Embrace texture
Create a luxurious look with moderately priced faux-fur blankets and textured woven throws. They add visual interest, can perk up dated upholstery and come in handy on cold nights.

7 Get fresh
Employ Mother Nature to help make your decor feel more alive. Arrange a bouquet of supermarket flowers in a pretty vase, place a bowl of lemons or apples on the coffee table, or fill a hurricane lamp with mini pinecones to use as a centerpiece.
