- "The easiest way to transform a room is to paint it a different color. Just slap some paint on the walls, or even one wall, and you're going to change the whole look."
- 2 "A lot of people rely on their overhead lighting, but bringing in floor and table lamps creates a lot of drama and a lot of mood. Plus it's really inexpensive."
