To get a unified look, Hobbs uses a technique called "color mapping," where you repeat one or two hues in the patterns throughout the space.

### What you'll need:

- Orange, yellow and white felt
- ☐ Fabric glue
- 2 different sized drinking glasses



**Cut the circles**. To make a lemon coaster, use the larger of the two glasses to trace a circle on yellow felt; cut out. Then use the smaller glass to trace a circle onto white felt; cut out.

**Glue them together.** Using fabric glue or a hot-glue gun, affix the white circle atop the yellow circle.

**O** Add "slices." Cut six tiny triangles from yellow felt; glue to the white felt circle. Repeat with orange felt for orange coasters.
